Family Activities and Events:

Monthly or Throughout the Year

1. **Mission and Fun Day** (geared towards tweens) or 5th Sunday "Mission Sundays". Choose a mission to support and provide a project for kids and/or families (for example: hygiene kits, food bags, cards for Meals on Wheels boxes, etc.)
2. **Intergenerational Bible and Fun** (possibly during Education/Sunday School hour)
2. **Pray-dates** - Set aside a couple of hours (maybe on a Sunday, geared towards younger families). Include a time for a Bible story and/or craft and time for free play and fellowship.
3. **Playground Pizza Parties or Potlucks** - If your church has a playground (or other playspace), order pizzas after church and invite families to hang out and play after church.
4. **Sack Lunch Sundays** - Same idea as above, but provide a cooler with ice that families can leave their lunches during worship, then stay and have lunch/play time afterwards.
5. **Presentation of Bibles** - Could be a certain time of year, present students with their own Bibles (for example, 3rd graders get new Bibles each year)
6. **"Bible Navigator" Class** - Once Bibles are presented, offer a short class (maybe 2-4 sessions) where you teach kids how to use their new Bibles, find verses, make special bookmarks, identify the different sections, etc.

January

1. **Pop-up Epiphany** - for all ages.
2. **Church-wide Chili Cook-off** - Could be to kick-off "Souper Bowl of Caring", or just for fun!

February/March

1. **Month of Love**
2. **Shrove Tuesday Pancake Dinner before Ash Wednesday**
3. **Take Home Lent Activities and Readings for Families** - or activities for families during Holy Week
4. **Prayer Stations** - Set up before or after worship during Lent
5. **Lent-Centering Prayer** - Offered in person or on zoom during the week.

April

1. **All-Church Easter Celebration** - Might include storytime, egg hunt, Easter/spring-themed photo booth.
2. **Creation Picnic** - Church-wide potluck picnic held outside after worship.

May

1. **Gift of Young People Worship** - Similar to "Youth Sunday", where children and Youth are worship leaders.
2. **Senior Sunday** - Recognize ALL graduates (graduating from elementary school, middle school, high school, college, and graduate school) during worship with a special blessing, maybe reception after worship?
3. **Pop-Up Pentecost/Pentecost Picnic** - Hold worship outside and have a picnic afterwards.
4. **Send-Home Sabbath Bags**
 - a. Families are encouraged to take these on vacation with them
 - b. Includes:
 - i. items to create a Sacred Space wherever they are
 - ii. A liturgy or devotion to use
 - iii. Wondering questions
 - iv. A bulletin to use as a Worship guide
5. **Faith at Home Fair** - Based on Traci Smith's Faithful Families Toolkit.

Summer Activities (June and July)

1. **Vacation Bible School** - fun for kids of all ages! Recruit and commission volunteers, have special VBS worship.
2. **Star Word Check-In**
3. **Mission Mania**
 - a. Day trips to local charities
 - b. Examples:
 - i. Go to a nursing home to play games or lead a short Worship service
 - ii. Volunteer at a local food pantry (age permitting)
 - iii. Shop for food to donate to a local food pantry
 - c. Another option is to help advertise and plan a family-friendly mission trip for your church.
4. **Summer Family Fun Bags** - A bag of sidewalk chalk and bubbles with a simple note saying "Have fun! Love, ___Church"

5. **Camp Coordination** - This year, our church planned a couple of options at John Knox Ranch that we shared and advertised to parents if their children wanted to go to camp at the same time as other kids from church. This helped them know they would have some friendly faces there when they went.
6. **Outdoor Movie Nights** - Stream a movie out on the lawn of your church. Have people bring chairs or blankets to sit on and enjoy some time together!
7. **Bubbles with Buddies** - Plan a playdate and provide different bubble toys. Let the kids play while families connect.

August

1. Blessing of Backpacks/Bags & Devices

- a. Invite all ages to participate (not just school age children!)
- b. Make backpack tags for congregants to take if they would like.

September

1. Rally Day activities

- a. "Fall Fun Fest" where folks can learn about all of the different opportunities at church (classes, faith formation activities, volunteer opportunities, committees, etc.)

2. Back to School Breakfast

- a. Held during Education/Sunday School hour

October

1. Blessing of the Animals

- a. Have a special Blessing of the Stuffed Animals during the Young Disciples Message

2. Trunk or Treat/Fall Festival

3. Movie in the Patch

- a. Join with another church that has a Pumpkin Patch

November

1. Month of Gratitude

2. Take Home Gratitude Bags

- a. Be creative with contents!
- b. Maybe have something for families to make and give to another person

December

1. One Day Advent VBS or Advent Workshop

2. Advent Centering Prayer

- a. Offered during the week

3. Faith Formation/Sunday School Christmas Parties

4. Holiday Hoorah - Similar to the Easter celebration, choose an afternoon to have the "hoorah" and provide some arts and crafts, hot cocoa, family advent wreaths, etc.

5. Pop-up Christmas Pageant for all ages/Impromptu Pageant

- a. Have costumes/headpieces in the Narthex for folks to pick up before worship
- 6. **Pajamas and Carols**-it's so fun for the whole family.
- 7. **Christmas Sabbath Bags**
 - a. Include items for families to have their own Worship service at home the Sunday after Christmas
 - b. With the help of the senior pastor and music director, make a short "Christmas Devotion" video to be accessible for everyone
